Reading: We are continuing to have a focus on Reading. Home learning tasks were replaced with reading activities that are sent home each week. These are recorded in your child's Reading Planners. Please read at home each week with your child. At school we ensure that every child is heard read once a week by an adult. Tesco Grant: Thanks to collecting the blue tokens at Tesco we were awarded £1000 from Tesco grants. Eco club have taken charge of this money and we will working to adding an eco area to the school field.

Curriculum: This term the focus for the next project will be Discover (History focus). Your child will be immersed in researching and learning about a specific period in time. We deliver each termly project using a mastery model where children can explore content in increasing depth and complexity as they move through school. Propositional and procedural knowledge are developed through termly projects that are framed with a philosophical enquiry question. This approach allows us to make connections across the curriculum, whilst also developing the children's understanding of what makes each subject distinct and unique.
