

**History:** Through our 'Seaside Holidays' topic we will be looking at the Isle of Man as a holiday destination in the Victorian Era and throughout history. The children will study the similarities and differences between then and now and will look at various tourist attractions on the Island.

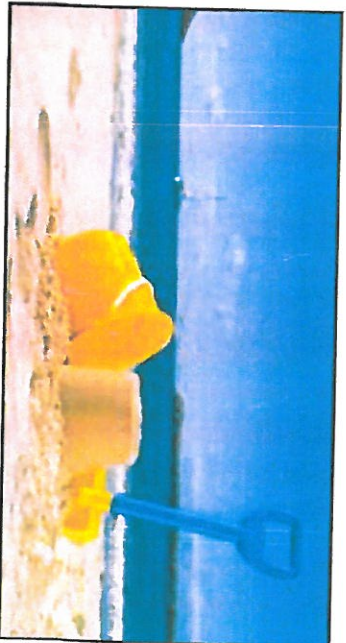
**Geography:** In Geography, children will identify physical and human features of the places we study. We will also look at popular holiday destinations throughout the world, locating them on a map.

**R.E:** Following the 'Come and See' Programme, our topics include: Spread the Word (Pentecost - Serving), Rules (Reconciliation) and Treasures (Universal Church).

**P4C:** The children will also participate in Philosophy for children (P4C) sessions.

**D.T. & Art:** In D.T. the children will have the opportunity to create sand sculptures. In art the children will create a variety of seaside inspired artwork including their own seaside paintings based on the artwork of local artist, Nicola Dixon.

**ICT:** The children will continue to access the St. Mary's wiki. They will use a number of programmes to support learning in other subjects. They will develop their typing skills, email work from an iPad, learn a number of keyboard short-cuts, and will practise closing documents and keeping a tidy desktop.



## Seaside Holidays

### Outdoor Learning:

We will be using our outdoor environment to explore learning opportunities throughout the curriculum.

### Maths Topics:

Our topics will include: number and place value; addition and subtraction; measuring weight and liquids; time; multiplication and division; number and fractions; understanding shape; mental addition and subtraction and handling data which will include drawing and interpreting Venn and Carroll diagrams.

### P.E. & Games:

The Summer term will focus on Athletics, Rounders and Cricket.

**Science:** Our new science topics will include Plants and Animals in the local environment & Variation.

**Music:** The children will learn some popular 'seaside' songs including some songs about the Isle of Man including 'Has anybody here seen Kelly' and 'Flanagan, take me to the Isle of Man again!'

**Literacy:** Our non-narrative Literacy topics this term will include instruction texts, information texts and explanation texts. The children will also look at different styles of poetry.

**PATHS:** The children will also participate in PaTHs sessions. PaTHs stands for Promoting Alternative Thinking Skills, an emotional literacy scheme where children learn how to self regulate their emotions. They learn to understand that all feelings are 'ok', but some behaviours are 'ok' and some are 'not ok'. PaTHs teaches the children how to make good choices about their behaviour.

**6Rs:** The children will continue to develop their 'relationships, resourcefulness, resilience, remember skills, readiness and reflectiveness' through our work this term.
