

6R's: The children will continue to develop their 'relationships, resourcefulness, resilience, remembering skills, readiness and reflectiveness' through our work this term.

Literacy: NARRATIVE

The children will be taught to

Plan their writing by:

- identifying the audience and purpose of the writing, selecting the appropriate form and using other similar writing as models for their own
- considering how authors have developed characters and settings

Draft and write by:

- describing settings, characters and atmosphere and including dialogue to convey character and advance the action
- using a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs

Evaluate and edit by:

- assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing
- proposing changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation

Music:

We will be exploring Manx music and dance in relation to our topic. The children will have the opportunity to compose their own.

P.E. & Games:

The children will be taught by an MSR coach on a Monday morning. This will cover skills and team games.

Science Topics:

Our science topics will include:

- Scientific Enquiry - carrying out investigations.
- Electricity - developing circuits.



Year 6 Autumn Term History on our Doorstep

Maths Topics:

The topics being covered this term:

Ordering numbers, place value, measures, area of 2D and 3D shapes, angles, multiplication and division, addition and subtraction, fractions, percentages, ratio and proportion, handling data and time. We will carry out a variety of practical activities to enhance their learning and carry out different investigations using and applying their knowledge of the subject.

P4C: The children will also participate in Philosophy for children (P4C) sessions.

Cross Curricular Topic

Our topic this term is History on our Doorstep. We will be exploring the Manx culture and heritage, through independent research and educational visits around the island.

HISTORY

Describing some of the events, people and periods studied.

Using information as evidence to test hypotheses. Describing characteristic features of past societies and periods.

GEOGRAPHY

Using knowledge to suggest suitable geographical questions.

Understanding how physical and human processes can change the features of places. Offer reasons for their own views about environmental change.

ART/DT

Explore ideas in different ways. Reflect on their work relating it to its intended use and identifying improvements. Measure, mark out and cut out materials accurately. Investigate and develop a range of practical skills. Take some creative risks with their work. Develop and explain ideas clearly with design objectives.

ICT: The children will continue to follow our ICT curriculum. To support our topic they will be using sketchup and garageband programmes. The children will have an opportunity to explore and use its learning and google docs. As well as this the children will also develop an awareness of copyright.
